



FUEL OIL SPILLS FROM ABANDONED HARBOR PIPELINE

Cause is a Corrosion Leak in an abandoned Black Oil Pipeline.

Approximately 300 gallons of fuel oil spilled.

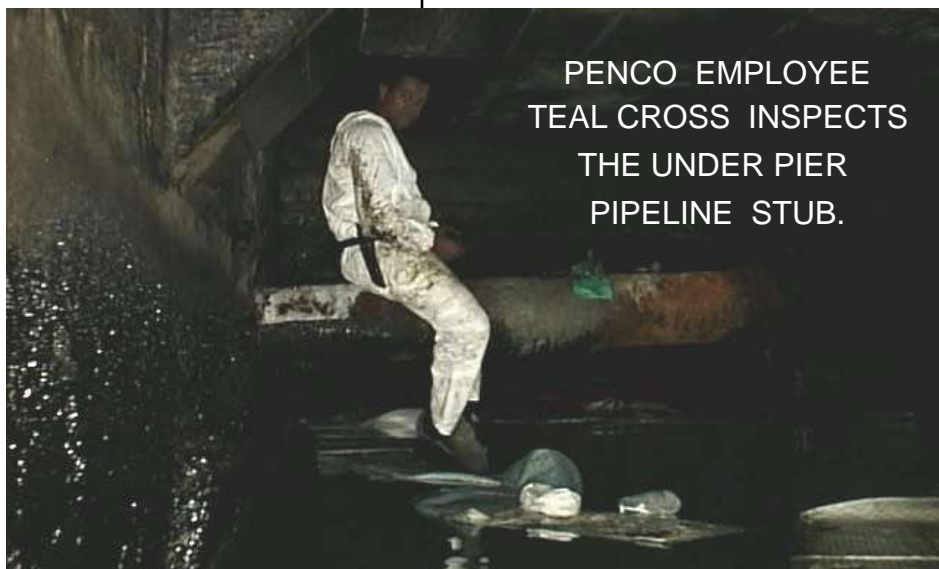
Fast response contained the oil near the source.

State of Hawaii Harbors Division becomes the Responsible Party



A black oil pipeline originally used for fuel deliveries to Pier 2 developed a corrosion leak during the evening hours of June 30, 1998. The fuel

barge "Holokai" happened to be docked at Pier 2. As the response progressed it became apparent that the barge was not the source of the leak and a morning search under the pier identified the stub end of an abandoned eight inch pipeline as the cause. Corrosion had eaten through the bottom of the pipe just outside of the bulkhead. The pipeline, abandoned some time in the 1950's, was left tied-in to live fuel lines in the Fort Armstrong area. Several hundred gallons of black fuel oil leaked under the pier and contaminated the barge and pier pyles. A quick response by CIC and Marine Logistics is credited with containing the oil near the source. PENCO assumed the follow up remediation work under Contract with the State Of Hawaii.
